

Women in Engineering Recognition Program

OFFICIAL RULES

The Women in Engineering Recognition Program begins at 12:00am (EST) on May 1, 2014, and ends July 31, 2014 at 11:59pm (EDT) (the "Recognition Program Period"). Each month during the Recognition Program Period, one nomination from all eligible nominees will be selected for the respective month for recognition by Dassault Systemes SolidWorks Corporation ("DS SolidWorks") from those entries received by 11:59 PM (EDT) on the 15th of each respective month during the Recognition Program Period.

1. **How to Enter.** Those who submit nominations must obtain the permission of a nominee prior to nominating them in this Program.
2. **Recognition.** The chosen nominee will be featured in an article on the SOLIDWORKS blog site and promoted through various social media platforms.
3. **Selection.** One woman will be recognized each month during Recognition Program Period, chosen by the 22nd day of each respective month, and recognized by by the 14th of the following month on the SOLIDWORKS blog site. The selection will be made by a panel of judges, who are members of the SolidWorks Marketing Team, which will select the woman to honor based demonstrated (a) leadership, (b) innovative accomplishments, and (c) contribution to the engineering community, each of which will be weighted in the final decision 30%, 35%, and 35% respectively. The woman to be recognized will be contacted by her nominator. In the event that DS SolidWorks is unable to locate the woman selected for recognition within five (5) business days of first contact attempt, an alternate nominee will be selected based on the same attributes. The probability of being selected depends on the number of eligible nominations received. DS SolidWorks cannot predict the probability because the company has no prior knowledge of the number of nominations that will be submitted.
4. **Sponsor.** DS SolidWorks is the sponsor of this Women in Engineering Recognition Program and will send you at no charge a copy of the rules of the Women in Engineering Recognition Program and/or a list of those women recognized during the Recognition Program Period (to the extent allowed by law) upon request to: Dassault Systèmes SolidWorks Corp., 175 Wyman Street, Waltham, MA, 02451, USA, Attn: Women in Engineering Recognition Program.
5. **Eligibility.** An eligible nominee is a woman working or studying in the area of engineering and/or technology area, is at least twenty-one (21) years of age at the time of entry, is a resident of the fifty (50) United States and the District of Columbia. Employees of DS SolidWorks, its affiliated companies and the immediate family members thereof, and any persons domiciled with such employees, and employees and officials of any U.S. federal government entity are not eligible to participate. Additionally, government and quasi-government employees are not eligible to participate. Void where prohibited by law.
6. **Acceptance.** A nominee's acceptance to be recognized constitutes permission for DS SolidWorks to publish her name and country of residence in any media, and to use her name and likeness for

advertising and promotional purposes without additional compensation, consideration, or consent, unless prohibited by law.
